

WOJCIECH ROSZKOWSKI, an eminent Polish historian, was born in 1947. From 1974 to 2010 he was associated with the Warsaw School of Economics, where he obtained consequent degrees in economic history and served as its Prorector between 1990 and 1993. In 1995 he was nominated as a Full Professor in history. From 1990 to the present day his main affiliation has been with the Institute of Political Studies of the Polish Academy of Sciences in Warsaw, where he was a Director from 1994 to 2000. For many years he lectured economic, Cold War and East Central European history to Polish and American students. From 1985 to 1986 he worked as a visiting researcher at Georgetown University. Between August 1988 and January 1989 he was a Fellow at the Wilson Center of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington D.C. and in the spring of 1989 he was a Visiting Professor in the Department of History of the University of Maryland. In the years 2000 to 2002 he was Kosciuszko Chair of Polish Studies at the University of Virginia in Charlottesville. From 2004 to 2009 he was a Member of the European Parliament. His Modern History of Poland was published in Polish. first in the underground under the pen-name Andrzej Albert, and then officially in many editions after the year 1990. His publications in English include: Landowners in Poland 1918–1939 (1991), Land Reforms in East Central Europe after World War One (1995), Changing Rules (co-author, 1997), The Shadow of Yalta (2005) and Biographical Dictionary of Central and Eastern Europe in the Twentieth Century (co-author, 2008).
